Food apartheid generates high rates of food insecurity, childhood obesity, diabetes, and heart disease in St. Louis. Thousands of children in St. Louis live in areas where there are no grocery stores nearby, and so their parents often "grocery shop" at gas stations. Eating processed food has become their lifestyle.



Many of these children have never eaten (nor know the names) of fruits & vegetables. The lack of good nutrition impacts their school performance and mental attitude as well as leads to diabetes and heart disease later in life.
